The Problem

Maryland has led the nation in education reform, channeling additional resources to K-12 schools before Wes Moore took office. But money is nothing without strategy. At the same time, Maryland has been contending with new and emerging challenges facing K-12 schools – a widening teacher shortage, sinking math and reading scores, and aging facilities.

Wes' Approach

His education agenda has centered on ensuring every student has the tools they need to succeed and are college or career ready before they graduate high school. Our Results

- **Historic K-12 Investments:** In partnership with the Maryland General Assembly, Wes Moore has increased education funding every single year he's been in office, putting over \$10 billion toward Maryland schools in this year's budget alone. Per-pupil funding has increased to \$11,811 and resources for school construction have jumped to a much-needed \$480 million.
- **A Narrowing Teacher Shortage:** In his first year, Wes committed to tackling Maryland's teacher shortage crisis by passing the Maryland Educator Shortage Reduction Act, and now, just three years later, the teacher vacancy rate has dropped 58%. This success also draws from the fact that Wes has raised teacher starting salaries to \$60,000 a year.
- **Rebounded Test Scores:** Recent reporting shows that statewide, nearly every single grade has made improvements in reading and math scores. Under Wes Moore, Maryland's public schools have improved for three consecutive years, according to the latest Maryland School Report Card.
- **Trusted Leadership:** In his first year as governor, Wes appointed Dr. Carey Wright to serve as Superintendent of Schools. Dr. Wright was the architect of the famed "Mississippi Miracle," viewed as the most successful push for education reform in the history of the country. She is bringing her expertise to the state.
- **Broader Pathways:** Wes wants every Marylander to achieve their full potential, no matter their pathways. He launched a historic Service Year Option for High School Graduates, helping young people take that next step from school into life. He has also partnered with trades and unions to train over 5,000 apprentices statewide.
